WELCOME BACK FRIENDS!



The preservation of “Tradition”, that’s pretty much our mission statement around here, at the Mid Michigan Old Gas Tractor Show. When you think about it, that’s a pretty broad directive. It sounds simple, but in practice, it isn’t. Take a moment and think about your own life story, how you used to do things. We don’t need a shrink to tell us that what we thought was a great plan when we were 16 would not likely be suggested by a “life coach” today. Some of that same philosophy translates quite directly to the evolution of an organization, as well. As the MMOGTA begins its 41st year of operation, we’ve had to learn and re-learn the lesson that things just don’t stay the same. That fence we used to jump over when we were 16 now becomes an obstacle that we either get stuck on or, at the very least have to find another way around. And so it is at the organizational level, you can preserve tradition, but you have to do it in an ever-changing world.

The small town of Oakley is no exception to this rule. Because of changes in land ownership, we had to re-route our traffic patterns and parking area for the annual show last year. The original parking lot west of the showgrounds had been a long term lease that served us well for over a decade, but had become unavailable, forcing dramatic changes to our grounds layout and traffic flow, both on and off the club property. We made the changes. As you make plans to attend the 2015 show, take note of the

maps in our showbook and on the website, especially if it’s been a couple of years since your last visit.

All of the above applies to the logistics of getting our job done efficiently, taking care of you, our spectators, exhibitors, campers, and friends, but definitely does not indicate a change in our mission. Along with the changes we had to make, there are always changes we want to make, like the addition of the (under construction) Stewart’s Mill building, along with plans for a “Made in Michigan” display to accompany that. Time and conditions will determine how advanced these projects are at show time. We continually strive to add facilities and displays that will enhance and expand your experience when you visit our show.

For 2015, we are also proud to announce the selection of Ford, Fordson, and New Holland tractors and equipment as the Featured Brand. You can’t get much more Michigan-centric than that. 

Frequently Asked...

If it rains, does the show close/shut down?

Absolutely not! Our show continues rain or shine!

Is there a fee to park?

No, parking is free.

Are pets allowed at the tractor show?

Pets are not allowed in the display or food areas, however, if you are camping they are allowed at your camp site. (Please do not leave pets in vehicles!)

Is alcohol allowed at the tractor show?

Alcohol is not allowed in the display area, including spectator bleachers. Alcohol is allowed in the designated bar areas and at your camp site only.

What if I have a medical emergency while I'm visiting the show?

We have a first aid station manned 24 hours a day during the show. It is located behind the Track 1 announcer stand.

Is there food available at the show grounds?

Yes, along with our Club Kitchen, there are many food vendors stationed around the show grounds.

Is there a way to tour the show without walking the whole thing?

Yes, we have people movers operating throughout the day. Grab a seat and enjoy the view!

Is there a lost and found?

Yes, Track 1 announcer stand doubles as our lost and found.

Will I be able to purchase an MMOGTA souvenir while I'm there?

Certainly! Visit the T-Shirt Shack located in front of the restrooms. Staff there will be happy to help you.

How old must you be to drive a tractor at the show?

You must be 13 years old to operate a tractor; unless a child is accompanied by an adult.

Can I have a passenger on my tractor?

You may have one passenger on your tractor as long as you also have fenders. No fenders=No riders.

How old must you be to drive a golf cart at the show?

You must be 16 years old with a valid drivers license to operate a golf cart.

If I am camping at the show grounds, are there showers available?

Yes, there are unisex and handicap showers available for all campers.

Is there a quiet time?

Yes, quiet time is from 11:00pm-7:00am starting Wednesday night.

Presidents Welcome



2015 Featured Brand—Ford and New Holland

There are few names in any industry with the depth of history, legacy, and familiarity that is associated with this year's feature. You can see it on the tailgate of the pickup in front of you, and in the blue oval on the front of the car behind you. Today, it's the name of a vehicle, but back in the early part of the 20th century, it was the name of a man...Henry Ford. Back then, he was more than just a man, he was a revolutionary. The "horseless carriage", the Model "T", the \$5 a day wage, the assembly line. He put the "motor" in the "Motor City", and workers from all over the eastern half of the Country flocked to Detroit to work at "the Ford", where they could get their piece of the American Dream.

Old Henry was the original "gearhead", who designed and built his original ideas, but he was so much more than that. He was stubborn, he was driven, often ruthless, and he was a visionary. He knew the money, and he knew the market. At about the same time that he was preparing the Model T to literally alter our culture, he also saw the opportunity to effect a similar change to

the world of agriculture, which largely worked at the speed of the horse, in those days. To be sure, the Fordson tractor never broke the Prairie, nor did an 8N ever follow the wheat harvest across the Great Plains, but that's not where the numbers were. The edges of this great land, the hills, the coasts, the orchards, were dotted with an endless array of 20, 40, 80 acre farms, where the long-suffering guy in the bib overalls trudged from sunup to sundown behind a team of horses.

That's where the numbers were, and those were Henry's people. He didn't build the biggest, most powerful tractors, maybe not even the best, but what he did build was the only one that those guys could afford. It was the same philosophy that put America on wheels with the Model T. Prior to that, the rich guys drove, while the rest were stuck behind a horse.

When the industry began to catch up with Henry, (Farmall, Deere, and others) Henry fought back by reducing his prices even further in the 1920's, driving a huge percentage of his competitors right out of business. Then, when the survivors really did begin to overtake his products, Henry dropped out of the tractor business for about 10 years, while he quietly planned for the next big thing. When the moment and the market were right, (about 1939), he jumped back in with both feet straddling the transmission of the 9N Ford. His well-planned re-entry was right in keeping with his philosophy of producing a product for the common man. The "N" series of tractors which were made from 1939 through the mid 1950's broke all the sales records, and their classic profile is still immediately recognizable today.

In August of 2015, the MMOGTA proudly invites and welcomes the owners of any Fordson, Ford, or New Holland machinery to help us celebrate the legacy of America's most famous industrialist, Henry Ford.


1. All exhibitors will camp in the general camping area



Camping

2015 CAMPING AT THE SHOW!

Come on out all you Ford enthusiasts! Last year we rearranged our camping and car parking layout and it worked very well. There is plenty of campsites and car parking spaces. Please follow the new signage indicating how you will get to your precise location at the show; be it camping, utility trailers or car parking for example. **All golf carts and similar types of vehicles must have proof of liability insurance to enter our grounds.** Thank you one and all and enjoy the show!

General Info: Campers will be handled on a first come first serve basis. No reservations. Campsites are primitive with access to fresh water, restrooms and showers. Our campgrounds will be open to the public starting Friday August 14, 2015. All campers (including club members) must stop at our gate and register before setting up camp. Any units placed on the grounds prior to the show, without registration, are subject to relocation at the discretion of the camping chairmen. You must be 18 years old to register a campsite. All children 17 years and under must be with a parent or guardian. Non-registered visitors to your campsite must leave before 1 am. People are not allowed in the exhibit/display areas after dark. We have available information on local churches and businesses.

Quiet Time: 11 pm - 7am. This begins at 11 pm Wednesday night and each night until the show is over. Please park carts by dark.

Fees/Passes: There is a flat rate of \$36.00 per camping unit, based on 2 adults. Additional adults, (18 years and older) per unit will be charged \$5.00 per person to camp. You must also purchase a weekend wristband for \$20.00 per adult. \$36.00 + \$20.00 + \$20.00 = \$76.00. The person registering the unit is responsible for all persons on their camp site. The camper sticker must be displayed on the camping unit and visible to staff. Wristbands must be worn on your wrist the entire show. Car passes, if issued, must be attached to your windshield and visible to staff. All stickers, wristbands and passes will be issued to you from your contact person upon registration or soon thereafter of your camping unit, exhibit, craft or concession. Please note that all vehicles without a car pass must park in the daily parking lot. This includes club members who are not camping.

Exhibitors: There is a \$5.00 fee for non-member exhibitors who request a camp site. Exhibitors are issued two free weekend wristbands for those who have registered their qualified tractor/display. Others with you must pay for additional wristbands, either a day or a weekend wristband (children based on age). Registration of your camper is required. Exhibitors not camping must park in the daily parking lot using their wristbands to enter the show. **Tractors are not allowed in the camping area, west side, except for the brief time it takes to exchange pulling equipment or make quick repairs.**

Personal people movers: They must have seating, hand hold and foot rest with heel catch for each passenger depending on the style of the unit. Platform style, must have securely fastened seats, a safety rail around it and not to exceed 4 foot width. They will be inspected by staff prior to use and issued a pass to be on our grounds.

Arts/Crafts, Concessions, Vendors: Cost for camping is \$25.00. This doesn't include the cost for your reserved display/sale area. Appropriate passes are issued by your contact person. Parking is not allowed at your display. Vehicles of those working for you must go to the daily parking lot. Stocking times are before 7 am and after 7 pm.

Golf carts & similar types of vehicles: These vehicles are allowed and golf cart rentals available at the show. **Proof of liability insurance is required for golf carts and similar types of vehicles to enter our grounds.** ALL must display a permit which is available at the registration hut and the main gate rental area. Operation is at slow speed. Types of permits available are: (a) *Purchased*, cost is \$20.00; (b) *Handicap*, which are free to camping guests only, with proof from the Secretary of State (issued portable mirror tag or license plate); (c) *Club worker*, which requires proof of committee you work for. Please park carts by dark. **Bicycles, mopeds, Golf carts, unauthorized people movers, unauthorized ATV's are not allowed.** Must be at least 16 years of age with a valid drivers' license to operate golf carts or similar types of vehicles on our grounds. Any joy riding, dangerous or underage operation of motor vehicles may result in having the vehicle and participant(s) removed from the grounds. Please follow the rules of our club or you will be asked to leave.

Play Area: The play area is open from 7 am until dark. Please be responsible for your children & keep the area clean. Children must be supervised by a parent or guardian on our grounds.

Pets: Pets must be on a leash, picked up after and controlled at all times, this includes barking. They must stay at your campsite and are NOT allowed in the show areas. Service animals will be authorized as permitted by law.

Trash: Place filled trash bags in front of your camper by 10:00 am daily for pickup. Please keep your campsite clean. Tidy up before you leave.

Club members: You may bring in your camping unit anytime after the grounds open if you have an assigned site. You must register your camping unit at show time. Information in this article applies to you as well. You may keep the same site yearly if it is maintained all year. If your site is not maintained or camper unit is not removed by October 31st, camping privileges will be revoked.




