



# Our History...

What follows is a melding of writings and recollections from Founding Member (the late) Jeanette Haak and long time member Frank Young:

In the early 1970's, a group of local friends who shared a common interest in vintage farm machinery began to travel to other parts of the state to attend festivals that featured such displays. It was said that Lawrence Haak and others hauled his Huber tractor to an established steam show in another area, only to be met with the instructions to just "leave it on the trailer", since gas powered units were viewed as "less worthy" (my words) than steamers. Feeling a bit rebuffed, the Brady Township crew sought other venues to display their prized antiques. Jeanette wrote in 1980, "In 1973, a group of people from Brady Township participated in the Jonesfield Township Centennial. They spent 2 days hauling machinery to Merrill, Michigan, and participated in a parade and set up a display. Seeing the interest people had in their efforts, the trio (Lawrence Haak, Bob White, and George Valentine) thought, "I wonder what would happen if we did this at Haak's farm?".


They had previously done a neighborhood threshing bee at Valentine's farm, but needed more space to grow grain for the event. They sensed local interest in the operation, and planned a broad based entertainment schedule, all with ties to farm family life in the earlier part of the 20th century, when neighbors worked and celebrated together; threshing, food, beverages, music, and dancing. Barns and sheds were emptied and cleaned to accommodate visitors. History reveals that shelter was a prudent plan, as a torrential rain dampened the boots, but not the spirits. Clear memories and fuzzy photos recall a wooden rowboat being towed around the field by an old John Deere. All was not lost, however, as the sun returned on the 3rd day of the show, and the level of interest from spectators, neighbors, and friends convinced them that this should be an annual event.

Having seen the potential for growth, the forwardthinking group decided the organization needed to be official, and a corporation was formed to meet the standards of the day. The Founding Members who formed the corporation were, Lawrence and Jeanette Haak; George and Doris Valentine; Bob and Carol White; Clayton and Fran Doty; and Walt and Ann Ritenburg. To be sure, there were others who were in on the ground floor, but the above listed were the signatures on the incorporation papers. They were significant as the early guiding voices, but also in the fact that their hard-working, fun-loving personalities literally shaped the character of our group, and those traits continue with us today.

The Mid-Michigan Old Gas Tractor Association, Inc. soon outgrew the Haak family farm, and began to lease and ultimately purchase the Ritenburg farm, as well as the adjacent Devereaux property, to accommodate the massive growth we have experienced over the 50 years of our history. Numerous permanent structures house an endless array of permanent displays appealing to a broad spectrum of interests. We proudly proclaim to host the largest display of "gas tractors" in the state, at the busiest working tractor show in the state! We'll add a few photos from the formative years, and cordially invite you to attend this years milestone edition of the Mid-Michigan Old Gas Tractor Show...50 years young!

# Frequently Asked...

#### If it rains, does the show close/shut down?

Absolutely not! Our show continues rain or shine!

#### Is there a fee to park?

No, parking is free.

#### Are pets allowed at the tractor show?

Pets are not allowed in the display or food areas, however, if you are camping they are allowed at your camp site. (Please do not leave pets in vehicles!)

#### Is alcohol allowed at the tractor show?

Alcohol is not allowed in the display area, including spectator bleachers. Alcohol is allowed in the designated bar areas and at your camp site only.

# What if I have a medical emergency while I'm visiting the show?

We have a first aid station manned 24 hours a day during the show. It is located along the west fence, just south of Track 1.

#### Is there food available at the Showgrounds?

Yes, along with our Club Kitchen, there are many food vendors stationed around the Showgrounds.

# Is there a way to tour the show without walking the whole thing?

Yes, we have people movers operating throughout the day. Grab a seat and enjoy the view!

# How old must you be to drive a golf cart at the show?

You must be at least 16 years old with a valid drivers license to operate a golf cart.



#### Is there a lost and found?

Yes, the Information Booth doubles as our lost and found.

# Will I be able to purchase an MMOGTA souvenir while I'm there?

Certainly! Visit the Souvenir Shack located in front of the restrooms. Staff there will be happy to help you.

#### How old must you be to drive a tractor at the show?

You must be 13 years old to operate a tractor; unless a child is accompanied by an adult.

#### Can I have a passenger on my tractor?

You may have one passenger on your tractor as long as you also have fenders. No fenders = No riders.

# If I am camping at the Showgrounds, are there showers available?

Yes, there are unisex and handicap showers available for all campers.

#### Is there a quiet time?

Yes, quiet time is from 11:00pm-7:00am starting Wednesday night.

# Can I bring my drone to the Showgrounds to take pictures/videos?

Drone owners must consult the registration booth regarding their use.

#### Is there an ATM on the grounds?

No, however, we do accept debit/credit cards (fees apply) at the gates, souvenir shack, and bar.

# Showground Safety Rules

- 1. Any tractors or engines that are running shall not 12. No one is to be on the display grounds between be left unattended.
- 2. There shall be no more than two (2) persons on 13. Vehicles with MMOGTA permits only. fenders means no riders.
- 3. All belted equipment must have a safety rope around it when in operation.
- 4. Anyone driving a tractor, truck, or any powered equipment must be on the equipment in a position as to be in full control of the vehicle.
- 5. Mower decks must be removed on all garden trac- 16. Minimum age limit of thirteen (13) years for optors/displays.
- 6. Everyone is responsible for keeping their area clean.
- 7. Parents are fully responsible for their children.
- 8. Speed limit not to exceed 5 miles per hour on grounds for all vehicles.
- 9. No person under the influence of drugs or alcohol 20. Alcohol in designated areas only. close to equipment that is in operation.
- 10. Firefighting equipment shall be on sight of, or close to, any equipment that is in operation.
- 11. Absolutely no smoking while fueling equipment.

Registration is very important to our club, it is the only way our club can retain accurate records of all who display at the show. Your display should be in working order. We encourage our members to operate their displays as long as it is done in a safe fashion. If you are exhibiting antique tools, toys, farm memorabilia, etc., we ask that your display be in nice order. All safety rules should be followed to keep yourself and others from being hurt.

Exhibitors - There is a \$10.00 camping fee for nonmembers who request a campsite. Exhibitors are issued two free weekend wristbands for those who have registered their qualified tractor/display. Others with you must pay for any additional wristbands. Registration of your camper is required. Exhibitors not camping must park in the daily parking lot.

All vehicles must use headlights and taillights after dark. Tractors without headlights and taillights must have a lighted escort.

Tractors are not allowed in the west side camping area except for the brief time it takes to exchange equipment or make quick repairs.



# Small Engine Exhibit Rules

- 1. All exhibitors will camp in the general camping area.
- 2. No support vehicles will be parked in the display area.
- 3. Engines may be displayed on a trailer, although the vehicle may not remain hooked up to the trailer.
- 4. Shade canopies may be set up within the display area as long as main walking aisles are kept clear.

Your cooperation is appreciated with the small engine display rules. We are working hard to meet the demands of our ever growing tractor show.

# Personal Tractor Sales

Sellers must purchase a 'For Sale' sign at the Registration Booth for \$25 per unit. Non-club 'For Sale' signs will be removed.

All tractors for sale that **do not run** will be grouped at the West fence line of the grounds.

All tractors for sale that **do run** will be displayed in the display field.



# Ride On Units/Personal Transportation Vehicles

Golf carts are allowed.

Vehicles may be inspected prior to approval.

Drivers must be 16 years of age and have a valid drivers license to operate these vehicles on our grounds. Proof of valid drivers license may be requested.

Bicycles, mopeds, go-carts, unauthorized people movers, and Japanese mini/micro trucks are <u>not al-</u> <u>lowed</u>. ATV's, UTV's, RTV's, and side-by-sides are permitted for handicap and club workers only.

Golf cart rentals available at the show.

All golf carts and similar types of vehicles must have proof of liability insurance to enter our grounds.

All units must display a permit which is available at the registration hut and the main gate Depot. Types of permits available are: (a) Purchased, cost is \$20.00; (b) Handicap, which are free with proof from a Sec-





retary of State issued portable mirror tag or license plate; (c) Club worker, which requires proof of committee you work for.

Headlights and taillights on all vehicles are a must after dark.

Operation speed is a fast walking pace. (5mph)

Any careless, reckless, or underage operation of motor vehicles/tractors may result in having the vehicle impounded and/or participant(s) removed from the grounds and camping/PTV/tractor privileges revoked for a year.

Types of vehicles NOT allowed: Yamaha YXZ1000R, CanAm Mavericks, Polaris RZR, Polaris General, Artic Cat Wildcat, Honda Talon, CanAm Commanders, CF Moto Z Force, Speed UTV, and all similar types of vehicles.

# Personal People Movers

Each mover must have seating, hand hold, and foot rest with heal catch for each passenger depending on the style of the unit.

Platform style must have securely fastened seats, a safety rail around it, and not to exceed 5 foot in width.

Personal people movers will be inspected prior to use and issued a pass to be on our grounds.

You may send a photo to the camping staff prior to the show to avoid your unit not being usable once it's here. Contact: Cheryl (989) 280-5453



# **Camping Information**

General Information: No reservations. Campsites are primitive with access to potable water. A large, clean bathhouse with restrooms is available and port-a-potties are placed throughout the grounds. Each campsite allows space for one vehicle. Extra vehicles must park in the day lot. Our campgrounds will be open to the public starting Friday, August 9, 2024. All campers (including club members) must stop at our gate and register before setting up camp. Any units placed on the grounds prior to the show, without registration, are subject to relocation at the discretion of the Pets: Service animals will be authorized as permitted by camping chairmen. You must be 18 years old to register a campsite. All children 17 years and under must be with a parent or guardian. Non-registered visitors to your campsite must leave before 1:00am. Campfires must be contained in a vessel/ring. People are not allowed in the exhibit/display areas after 10:00pm.

Quiet Time: 11:00pm-7:00am. This begins at 11:00pm Wednesday night and each night until the show is over.

Generator Run Time: 7:00am-11:00pm. Please tell staff if a generator is needed for medical purposes at registration.

Fees/Passes: We accept cash or debit/credit cards (fees apply). There is a flat rate of \$40.00 per camping unit, based on 2 adults. Additional adults (18 years and older) per unit will be charged \$5.00 per person to camp. You must also purchase a weekend wristband for \$20.00 per adult. \$40.00 + \$20.00 + \$20.00 = \$80.00. The person registering the unit is responsible for all persons on their camp site. The camper sticker must be displayed on the camping unit and be visible to staff. Wristbands must be worn on your wrist the entire show. Car passes, if issued, must be attached to your windshield and be visible to staff. All stickers, wristbands, and passes will be issued to you from your contact person upon registration. Please note that all vehicles without a car pass must park in the daily parking lot. This includes club members who are not camping.

**Exhibitors**: There is a \$10.00 camping fee for non-member exhibitors who request a camp site. Registration of your camper is required. Exhibitors not camping must park in

area except for the brief time it takes to exchange equipment or make quick repairs. More information on page 15.

You may keep the same site annually if it is maintained all year and you are a member in good standing according to our by-laws. If your site is not maintained, or camper unit is not removed by October 31st, you will be placed on one year probation or camping privileges revoked (2nd year violation).
