Feature Tractors: Ford...



The roots of Ford tractors can be traced back to the early 20th century when automobile pioneer, Henry Ford, sought to create affordable, efficient machines for farmers. Ford intended to revolutionize agriculture in the same way he had revolutionized automobile manufacturing by leveraging mass production techniques developed for the Ford Motor Company. In 1907, Ford built his first experimental Ford tractor and called it the “automobile plow”. It came with an engine and copper water jackets, and its rear wheels were taken from a binder.

In 1917, the Fordson Model F was first built by Henry Ford & Son, Inc. for export and introduced to American farmers. It was the first lightweight, mass produced tractor on the market, and sold for considerably less than competitive models, allowing even America's average farmers to purchase a new and reliable tractor. Fordsons were useful in more than just the fields; this versatile tractor could also haul building materials, switch loaded freight cars, plow snow, and more. It's innovative design and low cost helped it quickly gain popularity among farmers globally. Later that same year, the British government requested assistance from Ford to build large quantities of Fordson tractors to help raise desperately needed food to counteract the effect of an enemy blockade in World War I.

By the 1920s, 75% of all tractors built in the United States were Fordsons, and the Fordson had become one of the best-selling tractor lines globally. It was around this time that Ford & Son, Inc. was consolidated under the umbrella of the Ford Motor Company. In 1928, the Fordson tractor production in the

United States came to a halt, until 1939, when Henry Ford developed a working relationship with Harry Ferguson. The Ferguson-Sherman company, which made both plow and tractor parts, marketed the new Ford Model 9N with Ferguson's three-point hitch, hydraulic system, and superior maneuverability, until the relationship between Harry Ferguson and Ford Motor Company was severed in 1946. At this time, all production of the Ford Model 9N was halted. The following year, the Ford Model 8N was introduced. Featuring an improved transmission with four forward gears, better brakes, and a more powerful engine, this model became one of the most popular tractors in history.

In January 1953, Ford introduced the model NAA tractor, and marketed it as the “Golden Jubilee” model in recognition of the Ford Motor Company's 50th anniversary. This model showcased new overhead-valve engines, a live hydraulics system, and an updated design. Building on this platform, Ford introduced its Hundred Series tractors, each tailored to different farm sizes and horsepower needs, and all of which were built to handle front mounted equipment.

By the 1960s, Ford tractors were being produced on a global scale. With the introduction of the 1000 Series, which included five models of the most powerful tractors built by Ford, Ford's position in agricultural machinery was undeniable.

In 1986, Ford purchased the Sperry New Holland line of farm equipment to expand its agricultural division, re-branding it as Ford New Holland. This union allowed Ford to pair its tractor technology with New Holland's expertise in hay and forage equipment. In 1991, Ford sold its interest in the Ford-New Holland venture to Fiat, though the Ford name remained on some tractor models into the mid-to-late 1990s, it phased out as the New Holland name took precedence.

...and Massey Ferguson



The legacy of Massey Ferguson spans over 175 years and began in Canada, 1847, when Daniel Massey founded the Newcastle Foundry and Machine Manufactory. This company initially focused on building simple farm implements like ploughs and reapers, but after merging with A. Harris, Son & Co. in 1891 to form the Massey-Harris company, it quickly grew into a leading manufacturer of agricultural equipment.

Harry Ferguson was an Irish inventor and engineer focused on revolutionizing tractor design. In 1926, Ferguson patented his three-point hitch system. With this system, implements no longer needed wheels or axles, and it is now a standard feature on all modern tractors. Building on this success, Ferguson also developed a family of lighter and simpler implements to match the performance capacity of the tractor.

In 1930, while Ferguson was making a name for himself, Massey-Harris introduced their General Purpose" tractor; one of the first of its kind to feature four-wheel drive. This innovation gave farmers more control in difficult field conditions. Later, in 1937, Massey-Harris offered the first mass-produced, self-propelled combines and combine harvesters to the public, which quickly swept the market. The following year, Massey-Harris rolled out their Model 101 tractor, which introduced their electric starter. This feature reduced the time, effort, and tools needed for a farmer to start their engine, saving valuable time in the fields.

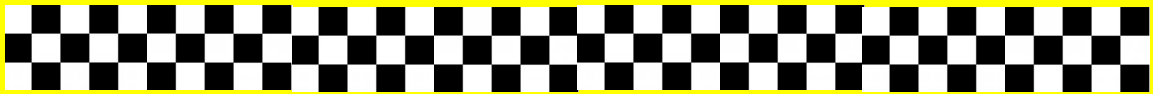
In 1939, Ferguson partnered with Henry Ford to produce the Ford Model 9N tractor, which featured

Ferguson's three-point hitch. When the partnership ended in 1946, Ferguson established his own company and began producing the iconic Ferguson TE20. This tractor was reasonably priced, lightweight, and powerful enough to replace a tractor one and a half times its size. The tractor also boasted increased safety features, increased productivity, and ease of use.

In 1953, Massey-Harris and Ferguson merged to form Massey-Harris-Ferguson, which was later rebranded as Massey Ferguson in 1958. With Massey-Harris's manufacturing expertise and Ferguson's advanced engineering, Massey Ferguson quickly became a powerhouse in the industry, and rapidly expanded its presence worldwide. Some of the more notable innovations Massey Ferguson introduced include Perkin's diesel engines, the Multi-Power transmission, and advancements in hydraulics (as an evolution of Ferguson's three-point hitch).

Following the merger, Massey Ferguson soon released the MF 35, known for its reliability, ease of use, and improved diesel engine performance, quickly making it a best-seller. But their success did not stop there! Massey Ferguson continued to manufacture successful tractors, including the MF 135, MF 165, MF 590, and MF 390.

In 1994, Massey Ferguson became part of AGCO Corporation. This acquisition allowed Massey Ferguson to benefit from AGCO's extensive resources, research, and global distribution network. Under AGCO, Massey Ferguson has continued to introduce new tractors with cutting-edge technology, eco-friendly engines, fuel efficiency improvements, enhanced precision farming capabilities, and automated systems. Even today, Massey Ferguson continues to impact the agricultural world with its tractors, with some of the more popular modern models including the MF 7600 Series, MF 4700 Series, MF 5700 Series, MF 6700 Series, MF 7700 S Series, MF 8700 S Series, MF 8S Series, and the MF 9S Series.

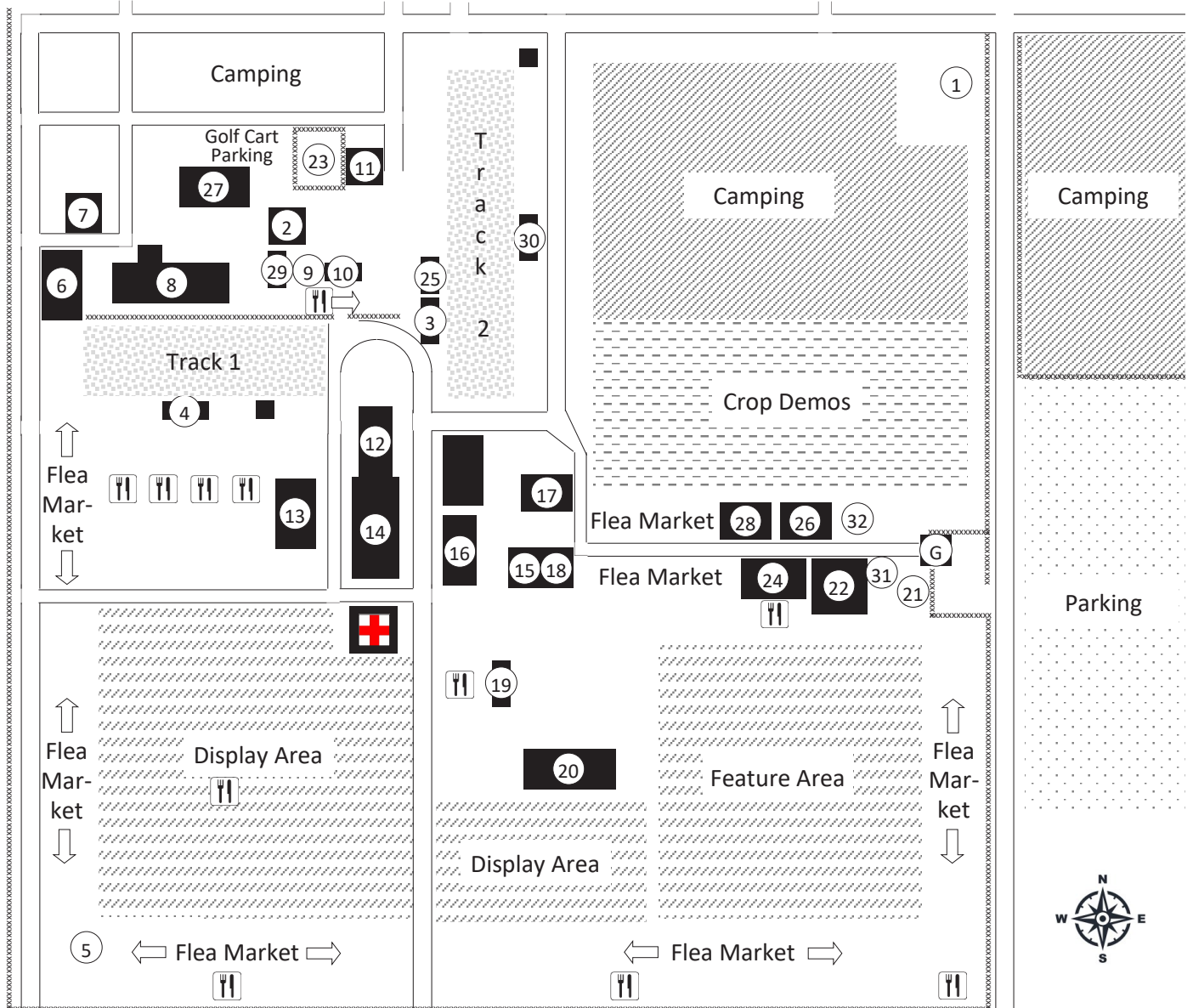

Frequently Asked...

If it rains, does the show close/shut down?

Absolutely not! Our show continues rain or shine!

Is there a fee to park?

No, parking is free.

Are pets allowed at the tractor show?

Pets are not allowed in the display or food areas, however, if you are camping they are allowed at your camp site. (Please do not leave pets in vehicles!)

Is alcohol allowed at the tractor show?

Alcohol is not allowed in the display area, including spectator bleachers. Alcohol is allowed in the designated bar areas and at your camp site only.

What if I have a medical emergency while I'm visiting the show?

We have a first aid station manned 24 hours a day during the show. It is centrally located on the main road of our display area.

Is there food available at the Showgrounds?

Yes, along with our Club Kitchen, there are many food vendors stationed around the Showgrounds.

Is there a way to tour the show without walking the whole thing?

Yes, we have people movers operating throughout the day. Grab a seat and enjoy the view!

How old must you be to drive a golf cart at the show?

You must be at least 16 years old with a valid drivers license to operate a golf cart.

Is there a lost and found?

Yes, the Information Booth doubles as our lost and found.

Will I be able to purchase an MMOGTA souvenir while I'm there?

Certainly! Visit the Souvenir Shack located in front of the restrooms. Staff there will be happy to help you.

How old must you be to drive a tractor at the show?

You must be 13 years old to operate a tractor; unless a child is accompanied by an adult.

Can I have a passenger on my tractor?

You may have one passenger on your tractor as long as you also have fenders. No fenders = No riders.

If I am camping at the Showgrounds, are there showers available?

Yes, there are unisex and handicap showers available for all campers.

Is there a quiet time?

Yes, quiet time is from 11:00pm-7:00am starting Wednesday night.

Can I bring my drone to the Showgrounds to take pictures/videos?

No, drones are not permitted on the Showgrounds.

Is there an ATM on the grounds?

No, however, we do accept debit/credit cards (fees apply) at the gate, registration hut, souvenir shack, and bar.

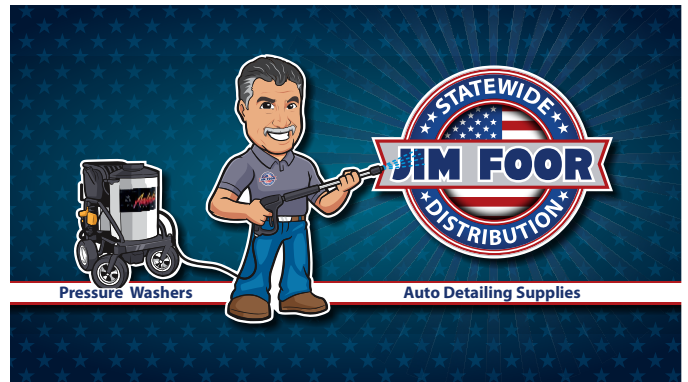

1. Any tractors or engines that are running shall not be left unattended.
2. There shall be no more than two (2) persons on one tractor that is moving at one time; and no fenders means no riders.
3. All belted equipment must have a safety rope around it when in operation.
4. Anyone driving a tractor, truck, or any powered equipment must be on the equipment in a position as to be in full control of the vehicle.
5. Mower decks must be removed on all garden tractors/displays.
6. Everyone is responsible for keeping their area clean.
7. Parents are fully responsible for their children.
8. Speed limit not to exceed 5 miles per hour on grounds for all vehicles.
9. No person under the influence of drugs or alcohol shall be allowed to operate any equipment, or be close to equipment that is in operation.
10. Firefighting equipment shall be on sight of, or close to, any equipment that is in operation.
11. Absolutely no smoking while fueling equipment.
12. No one is to be on the display grounds between 10:00pm and 6:00am without notifying security.
13. Vehicles with MMOGTA permits only.
14. Drivers must be at least 16, have a valid drivers license, and proof of insurance for golf carts and similar type of vehicles to enter our grounds.
15. **Bicycles, mopeds, go-carts, unauthorized people movers, and Japanese mini/micro trucks are not allowed. Golf carts are allowed. ATV's, UTV's, RTV's, and side-by-sides are permitted for handicap and club workers only.**
16. Minimum age limit of thirteen (13) years for operating a tractor unless child is accompanied by an adult or parent.
17. People movers require a seat for each passenger.
18. All vehicles operating after dark must have and use proper lighting.
19. No glass containers allowed in display areas.
20. Alcohol in designated areas only.
21. Drones are not permitted on the premises.
22. The smoking or vaping of marijuana is strictly prohibited on these premises.

Golf carts are allowed.

Vehicles may be inspected prior to approval.

Drivers must be 16 years of age and have a valid drivers license to operate these vehicles on our grounds. Proof of valid drivers license may be requested.

Bicycles, mopeds, go-carts, unauthorized people movers, and Japanese mini/micro trucks are not allowed. *ATV's, UTV's, RTV's, and side-by-sides are permitted for handicap and club workers only.*

Golf cart rentals are available through a third party vendor at the show.

All golf carts and similar types of vehicles must have proof of liability insurance to enter our grounds.

All units must display a permit which is available at the registration hut and the main gate Depot. Types of permits available are: (a) Purchased, cost is \$50.00 non-member/\$30.00 member; (b) Handicap, which

are free with proof from a Secretary of State issued portable mirror tag or license plate; (c) Club worker, which requires proof of committee you work for.

Headlights and taillights on all vehicles are a must after dark.

Operation speed is a fast walking pace. (5mph)

Any careless, reckless, or underage operation of motor vehicles/tractors may result in having the vehicle impounded and/or participant(s) removed from the grounds and camping/PTV/tractor privileges revoked for a year.

Types of vehicles NOT allowed: Yamaha YXZ1000R, CanAm Mavericks, Polaris RZR, Polaris General, Arctic Cat Wildcat, Honda Talon, CanAm Commanders, CF Moto Z Force, Speed UTV, and all similar types of vehicles.

Personal People Movers

Each mover must have seating, hand hold, and foot rest with heel catch for each passenger depending on the style of the unit.

Platform style must have securely fastened seats, a safety rail around it, and not to exceed 5 foot in width.

Personal people movers will be inspected prior to use and issued a pass to be on our grounds.

Camping Information

Welcome participants and guests to our 52nd annual show. Our feature tractors this year are Ford and Massey Ferguson! Both of these fine brands will be well represented here at Oakley. Come on out for a day, or camp the week. Enjoy your visit with our club and other tractor enthusiasts. You'll be amazed by all the activities and displays gathered here!

General Information: No reservations. Campsites are primitive with access to potable water. A large, clean bathhouse with restrooms is available and port-a-potties are placed throughout the grounds. Each campsite allows space for **one vehicle**. Extra vehicles must park in the day lot. *Our campgrounds will be open to the public starting Friday, August 14, 2026 at 8:00am.* Camping opens one week prior to the show. All campers (including club members) must stop at our gate and register before setting up camp. Any units placed on the grounds prior to the show, without registration, are subject to relocation at the discretion of the camping chairmen. You must be 18 years old to register a campsite. All children 17 years and under must be with a parent or guardian. Non-registered visitors to your campsite must leave before 1:00am. Campfires must be contained in a vessel/ring 30" or less in diameter. People are not allowed in the exhibit/display areas after 10:00pm.

Quiet Time: 11:00pm-7:00am. This begins at 11:00pm Wednesday night and each night until the show is over.

Generator Run Time: 7:00am-11:00pm. Please tell staff if a generator is needed for medical purposes at registration.

Fees/Passes: We accept cash or debit/credit cards (fees apply). There is a flat rate of \$45.00 per camping unit, based on 2 adults. Additional adults (18 years and older) per unit will be charged \$5.00 per person to camp. You must also purchase a weekend wristband for \$30.00 per adult. \$45.00 + \$30.00 + \$30.00 = \$105.00. The person registering the unit is responsible for all persons on their camp site. The camper sticker must be displayed on the camping unit and be visible to staff. Wristbands must be worn on your wrist the entire show. Car passes, if issued, must be attached to your windshield and be visible to staff. All stickers, wristbands, and passes will be issued to

you from your contact person upon registration. Please note that all vehicles without a car pass must park in the daily parking lot. This includes club members who are not camping.

Exhibitors: There is a \$15.00 camping fee for non-member exhibitors who request a camp site. Registration of your camper is required. Exhibitors not camping must park in the daily parking lot using their wristbands to enter the show. Tractors are not allowed in the west side camping area except for the brief time it takes to exchange equipment or make quick repairs. More information on page 17.

Craft Show/Concession Vendors: Camping is \$30.00. One vehicle per site. Camping cost NOT included in your reserved display/sale area fee. Appropriate passes are issued by your contact person. Parking is not allowed at your display. Vehicles of those working must go to the daily parking lot. More information on page 21.

Pets: Service animals will be authorized as permitted by law. Pets are NOT allowed in the display areas. Pets must be on a leash, picked up after, controlled at all times (this includes barking), and must stay at your campsite.

Trash: Place bags in front of your camper by 10:00am daily during the show for pickup. Please keep your campsite clean. Tidy up before you leave.

Club Members: Camping units are allowed anytime after the grounds open if you have an assigned site. You may select/place a camping unit on a campsite in the main camping field the day of the August club meeting with assistance from the camping staff. You must register your camping unit at show time. Information in this Show Book applies to all members as well as the public. You may keep the same site annually if it is maintained all year and you are a member in good standing according to our by-laws. If your site is not maintained, or camper unit is not removed by October 31st, you will be placed on one year probation or camping privileges revoked (2nd year violation).

Depot/Train Display

Some may wonder why there's a depot and train display at a tractor club, but that is part of our mission. 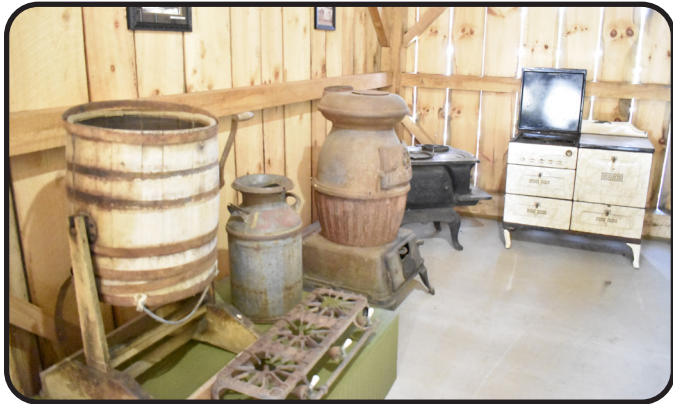

This very mill previously spent many years taking grain and turning it into flour. The amount of bread, muffins, pies, cookies, etc. that resulted from a single mill such as this is unmeasurable. Getting this display from a static one, to fully operational, has been an on going project for us. Our restoration team is working hard to make that happen.

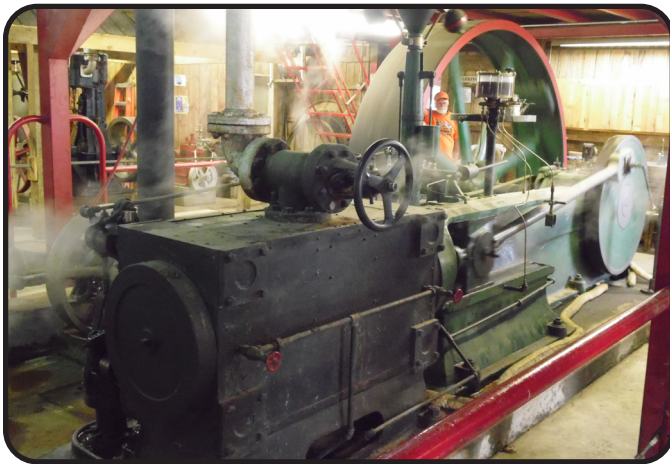
Handle Mill
